

LUNCHEON SIGN-UP

Sons in Retirement originated in 1958 in San Mateo when four retired businessmen got together for a social luncheon with the purpose of promoting this activity for all retired men. This idea evolved into the organization that you are involved with today. We continue to believe that holding luncheons for social



interaction and to listen to timely presentations is a wonderful activity. We hope that you value this, as well. The monthly luncheon is the backbone of SIR and why SIR exists. If you have not attended these luncheons for a while, we encourage you to join your fellow SIR members and enjoy retirement life.

We ALL must sign up to attend the Branch 8 luncheon held at Boundary Oak Golf Course, 3800 Valley Vista Rd., Walnut Creek, CA. You will have a choice of a meat, fish, or vegetarian entrée. You can also select no meal. Please tell us which entrée you want when you sign-up:

- Three sign-up methods will be available for yourself and if you want to bring a guest. Just let us know including your choice of meal:
 - a. A Constant Contact email requesting your action to sign up to attend a Branch 8 luncheon will be sent to you. Click on the link in this email to electronically sign up for the next luncheon. You will need to enter your name as well as any guest's names, your and your guest's meal preference. You should receive a message immediately that your response has been recorded. This is the preferred method.
 - Send an email message to <u>sirbr8attendance@outlook.com</u>. You will receive a confirming email.
 - c. Call 925-901-4826 to sign up for the luncheon by phone.
- You must sign 5 calendar days before the next luncheon (i.e., the Wednesday before the luncheon). This deadline is necessary because we must provide a final headcount to Boundary Oak.
- 3. We have been fortunate in being able to accommodate those who sign up late or simply walk-in. If you are not on the sign-up list for the meal and want to attend; do come, and, if available, we will sell you a meal. If meals appear to be sold out, we will ask you to wait until 11:15 AM so we can confirm that a meal is available. You are always welcome to attend the meeting and listen to the speaker.
- As before, you will bring a personal check for \$36.00 made out to SIR Branch 8, or cash to the luncheon as payment.

- If you sign up, but do not attend the luncheon, or if you cancel after 5-days prior to the luncheon, you remain subject to payment because we owe Boundary Oak for the lunch that they have prepared for you.
- 6. If you have any questions regarding the sign-up process, contact Manuel Dominguez (dominguezx@comcast.net) or Dan Smith (dns.lns02@astound.net).

Constant Contact emails have been very successful and makes sign-up easy. However, these emails do not reach all members for one reason or another. If you believe that you have been missed, or if away during the sign-up period, you can always use the attendance email or voicemail given above anytime. You should do this at least 5-days prior to the luncheon to ensure that you have a meal.



review of the opening performance with the link below. OperaWire wasn't totally pleased, but the Met has had a couple of months to iron out the problems, and the HD cinema performances are usually spectacular, with the stars performing for the whole world and their home countries. New York Classical Review, link below, was less critical.

The Saturday matinee performance of Nabucco comes to our Century cinemas live on January 6 at 9:55 am, running 125 minutes, plus intermission (probably 30 minutes). But as you all know, sometimes the intermission is the most interesting part. "Encore" performances of the same show will be the following Wednesday at 1:00 pm and 6:30 pm. It is one of the great operas I watch whenever I get a chance.





Master Gardeners. TIPS!

Fall is the ideal time to plant California natives and other Mediterranean plants that grow with our winter rains and bloom in late winter and spring. Planting now gives the roots of these plants time to grow into the soil and become established before the high temperatures and dry climate of our summers.

Shrubs are multi-branched plants smaller than trees and more prominent than bushes. Shrubs are long-lived perennial woody plants that can be evergreen or deciduous (lose their leaves). Although not as long-lived as multi-century-old trees, most native shrubs can live for decades in nature and our gardens, compared to commercial, hybridized, and non-native shrubs, which must be replaced more frequently than native shrubs.

January 9, 2024 Easy Hike – Diablo Hills Golf Course to Downtown Walnut Creek, 10:00 a.m.

Hike Description – Yes, this is the November easy hike that got cancelled.



We are repurposing this hike because the venue is perfect for a wet-weather outing should it be a rainy start to 2024.

This is an out-and-back hike of 3.2 miles, starting at 10:00 a.m. The paved hike starts at the Contra Costa Regional Canal Trail, which we can access from the parking lot near The Gardens at Heather Farm on Marchbanks Drive, across the street from the Diablo Hills Golf Course parking lot. We hike past the Heather Farm Community Garden and Lake. When we reach the Iron Horse Trail, we make a left to downtown Walnut Creek, We return to our trailhead via the reverse route.

Directions to Trailhead – Take Ygnacio Valley Road to Marchbanks Road. Turn left on Marchbanks if heading east on Ygnacio (or right if heading west on Ygnacio). When you reach the golf course on the right, park on the street. There are plenty of spaces.

January 30, 2024 Hard Hike - A Modified Lafayette Reservoir Rim Trail, 10:00 a.m.

Hike Description - This is a 5.3-mile loop hike, with 712 feet of elevation gain. It incorporates ½ of the Lafayette Reservoir Rim Trail with ½ of the paved Lakeside Trail. (This "modification" eliminates the infamous "cardiac hill" climb, which dogs all Rim Trail hikers.) We will travel the full route if the weather has remained relatively dry, but if the dirt Rim Trail is muddy, we will stick to the paved Lakeside Trail, shortening the hike to about 4 paved miles in total. We first hike from your parking spot, near the intersection of Mt. Diablo Blvd. and Village Center, up to the main Reservoir parking lot. Then we head up to the Rim Trail in a counterclockwise direction until we find ourselves at its western-most edge, before descending on the Canyon Trail to the paved Lakeside Trail. We continue counterclockwise on the paved foot trail to the parking lot and then down to our parked

There are restrooms at the Reservoir parking lot.

Directions to Hike - Highway 24 west to Acalanes Rd. exit, turning south to Mt Diablo Blvd. Take a left and travel about one mile. We will meet at 10:00 am on the corner of Mt. Diablo Blvd. and Village Center, Lafayette, across from the Veteran's Memorial Center. There is FREE PARKING on the South side of Mt. Diablo Boulevard.

Bring: Hats, water, sturdy hiking boots, trekking poles. Umbrellas optional.


