LUNCHEON SIGN-UP

Sons in Retirement originated in 1958 in San Mateo when four retired businessmen got together for a social luncheon with the purpose of promoting this activity for all retired men. This idea evolved into the organization that you are involved with today. We continue to believe that holding luncheons for social



interaction and to listen to timely presentations is a wonderful activity. We hope that you value this, as well. The monthly luncheon is the backbone of SIR and why SIR exists. If you have not attended these luncheons for a while, we encourage you to join your fellow SIR members and enjoy retirement life.

We ALL must sign up to attend the Branch 8 luncheon held at Boundary Oak Golf Course, 3800 Valley Vista Rd., Walnut Creek, CA. You will have a choice of a meat, fish, or vegetarian entrée. You can also select no meal. Please tell us which entrée you want when you sign-up:

- Three sign-up methods will be available for yourself and if you want to bring a guest. Just let us know including your choice of meal:
 - a. A Constant Contact email requesting your action to sign up to attend a Branch 8 luncheon will be sent to you. Click on the link in this email to electronically sign up for the next luncheon. You will need to enter your name as well as any guest's names, your and your guest's meal preference. You should receive a message immediately that your response has been recorded. This is the preferred method.
 - Send an email message to <u>sirbr8attendance@outlook.com</u>. You will receive a confirming email.
 - c. Call 925-901-4826 to sign up for the luncheon by phone.
- You must sign 5 calendar days before the next luncheon (i.e., the Wednesday before the luncheon). This deadline is necessary because we must provide a final headcount to Boundary Oak.
- 3. We have been fortunate in being able to accommodate those who sign up late or simply walk-in. If you are not on the sign-up list for the meal and want to attend; do come, and, if available, we will sell you a meal. If meals appear to be sold out, we will ask you to wait until 11:15 AM so we can confirm that a meal is available. You are always welcome to attend the meeting and listen to the speaker.
- As before, you will bring a personal check for \$36.00 made out to SIR Branch 8, or cash to the luncheon as payment.

- If you sign up, but do not attend the luncheon, or if you cancel after 5-days prior to the luncheon, you remain subject to payment because we owe Boundary Oak for the lunch that they have prepared for you.
- 6. If you have any questions regarding the sign-up process, contact Manuel Dominguez (dominguezx@comcast.net) or Dan Smith (dns.lns02@astound.net).

Constant Contact emails have been very successful and makes sign-up easy. However, these emails do not reach all members for one reason or another. If you believe that you have been missed, or if away during the sign-up period, you can always use the attendance email or voicemail given above anytime. You should do this at least 5-days prior to the luncheon to ensure that you have a meal.

Again, we request that if you sign up and then change your mind about attending, please cancel before the 5-days prior to the luncheon cutoff. Late cancellations and no shows cost the Branch. We do not charge membership for missed meals when the reason is health related.

Our book for February was "Benjamin Franklin" by Walter Isaacson. It was very well written with detailed information that clearly shows Frankin as being almost, if not equally, as important to the success of the American Revolution and the development of the United States as George Washington. It also describes the

tremendous impact Franklin had outside of politics—the first lending library, the first fire brigade, the first practical demonstration of electricity, the invention of the lighting rod (which dramatically reduced the number of fires and deaths from lightning), the first proof of the Gulf Stream, the set-up first non-religious college in America (which became the University of Pennsylvania), and so much more. The group's overall rating was 4,5 out of a possible 5. This was our first book not to have anyone rating it lower than 4.

Our next book is a work of fiction—"Cat's Cradle" by Kurt Vonnegut—which will be discussed at our meeting on Tuesday, March 5.

We meet at the Concord Round Table Pizza on Treat Boulevard on the first Tuesday of each month. If you like to read and have lively discussions about the books you have read, you should think about joining our group. Eleven Car Enthusiasts and guests visited the California Highway Patrol Academy in West Sacramento, CA on Tuesday, February 20th. We were a bit unsure of the weather, but the clouds parted and clear skies followed us through the drive to Sacramento and the rain held off until we neared home on the return trip.

The tour was exceptional and the campus is beautiful. Cadets spend 26 weeks training and learning how to be a CHP Officer. We were greeted in the lobby by Officer Dancey who turned out to be an outstanding tour guide escorting the group through the Museum and beautiful Campus.

We began tour with an exchange of who we were and why we came to tour the Academy, a lively discussion. Our guide followed with a review and history of a 1969 Dodge Polara on display on the lobby. A period perfect vehicle restored and presented to the Academy by a true Car Enthusiast who was not ever a patrolman, just a CHP enthusiast. We moved into the Academy Museum and were treated to an excellent summation of the extensive displays by our guide. We spent so much time in the museum asking questions as Officer Dancey delivered the history of the patrol from its creation in the 1800's to present day operations, that we gobbled up tour time and had to cut short some of the other areas the guide had intended to show us. I think we will need to visit this location again and see more of the car collection and training program.

We visited the quad to see the fountain memorial to fallen officers and heard about several of the men who gave the ultimate sacrifice in an attempt to keep California citizens safe and protected. There were many names presented on brass tags around the fountain. It was amazing how detailed our guide was in telling their stories.

The tour needed to terminate as the cafeteria that was to serve us lunch was nearing close time. We were treated to a cafeteria style lunch, Salad Bar, choice of Ribs, Chicken, or Chili, fruit salad, drink choice and Ice Cream Dessert, all for just \$7 a person. Obviously, our tax dollars at work, but excellent. We started at 9:30 AM in Walnut Creek and were home by about 2:45 PM, thoroughly delighted. An excellent outing.





Master Gardeners. TIPS!

Fall is the ideal time to plant California natives and other Mediterranean plants that grow with our winter rains and bloom in late winter and spring. Planting now gives the roots of these plants time to grow into the soil and become established before the high temperatures and dry climate of our summers.

Shrubs are multi-branched plants smaller than trees and more prominent than bushes. Shrubs are long-lived perennial woody

plants that can be evergreen or deciduous (lose their leaves). Although not as long-lived as multi-century-old trees, most native shrubs can live for decades in nature and our gardens, compared to commercial, hybridized, and non-native shrubs, which must be replaced more frequently than native shrubs.

Hike Description – This is a 3.2-mile hike with 56 feet of elevation gain, all on paved walkways. Imagine a one-mile wooded

park in downtown San Francisco and a thirty-foot waterfall in the Financial District. Yes, these wonders and more are yours to gaze upon in this all-paved tour, just minutes from the Embarcadero BART Station in San Francisco. We will ride in the same BART car (see special start time instructions below) from the East Bay, exiting at the Embarcadero Station. Our first stop is the Salesforce [elevated] Park which spans three blocks in downtown SF. We take the Salesforce tram up to the park level for a circular traverse of the park, stopping at restrooms as needed. We then descend to street level and head west, ducking through the "Wild Thing" alley park, emerging at Yerba Buena Gardens to view the myriad of water treatments that dot this area. We then cross Market Street to feast at Schroeder's, a venerable SF German restaurant featuring Brats and Beer. The return BART station is then close by for our return to the East Bay.

March 26 2024 Hard Hike – Shell Ridge via Hanna Grove Trail Loop, 10:00 a.m.

Hike Description – This is a moderate/hard hike of approximately 4.25 miles, and it includes 870 feet of elevation gain. Starting at the Hannah Grove Trail (which is a private road at that point), we continue past Borges Ranch to the Briones-Mt. Diablo Trail, heading west, which we then take to the Ginder Gap Trail. We return on the Sulphur Creek and Costanoan trails, back to Hannah Grove. Shell Ridge in the early springtime is a riot of fresh green colors.

Continue west on Comistas past Hannah Lane (aka Hanna Grove Trail) and find a place to park on the street. Note: Parking on school days is restricted to areas west of Comistas Ct. (on the left) and 2910 Comistas Dr. (on the right). After parking on Comistas, we will meet at the head of Hannah Lane where it meets Comistas Dr. and we will walk together uphill to the Hannah Grove Trailhead.


