#### **BIG SIR COLUMN**



Thought I would take a few minutes to try to update the membership on how we arrived at a \$38.00 for our 2025 monthly luncheons.

In October of 2023, SIR Branch 8 entered into a contract with Boundary Oak for our monthly luncheon, with us being charged a total price of \$38.55 per plated lunch. The membership was paying \$35.00 at the time for each plate.

The BEC Committee voted to raise the 2024 lunch price by \$1 to \$36.00 per

plate, thus leaving the branch to subsidize each lunch plate by \$2.85. This gave us an average expense of \$400-\$500 per month (assuming 100-105 attendees), including debit for speakers and guests and voucher lunches.

In November of 2024, we negotiated a new contract with Boundary Oak for 2025, for the same plated lunch, down to a total of \$36.81 per plate. The Ladies Day Luncheon will remain the same in 2025.

The 2025 price of \$38.00 per luncheon plate will cover the Boundary Oak charge, plus partially covering the expense for the speakers' lunches, guests, and voucher lunches.

We will still have, hopefully, a small debit. But this will give us more funds to be used in other areas, such as increasing membership, marketing, supporting activities, Ladies Day Luncheon, and special events and activities.

Remember the SIR dues in 2025 remain the same as 2024 (\$55.00)!

I hope this information is helpful and explains the increased charge for our monthly luncheon. We understand the quality of the food must remain elevated (constantly), along with strong service, as it has been. These areas have been made perfectly clear to the Boundary Oak staff & management.

Please continue to fill out the comment cards left on the lunch tables. We need your comments and input! Let's increase the luncheon turnout! How about mentioning the lunch to a fellow member who has NOT attended a lunch recently, or since Covid, to join us? Yes, I know that the speakers have an effect on luncheon attendance, and we are working on this also. SIR is a great organization, so let's get behind it in 2025! Your comments are always welcome & appreciated.

We ALL must sign up to attend the Branch 8 luncheon held at Boundary Oak Golf Course, 3800 Valley Vista Rd., Walnut Creek, CA. You will have a choice of a meat, fish, or vegetarian entrée. You can also select no meal. **Please tell us which entrée you want when you sign-up:** 

- Three sign-up methods will be available for yourself and if you want to bring a guest. Just let us know including your choice of meal:
  - a. A Constant Contact email requesting your action to sign up to attend a Branch 8 luncheon will be sent to you. Click on the link in this email to electronically sign up for the next luncheon. You will need to enter your name as well as any guest's names, your and your guest's meal preference. You should receive a message immediately that your response has been recorded. This is the preferred method.
  - Send an email message to <u>sirbr8attendance@outlook.com</u>. You will receive a confirming email.
  - c. Call 925-901-4826 to sign up for the luncheon by phone.
- You must sign 5 calendar days before the next luncheon (i.e., the Wednesday before the luncheon). This deadline is necessary because we must provide a final headcount to Boundary Oak.
- 3. We have been fortunate in being able to accommodate those who sign up late or simply walk-in. If you are not on the sign-up list for the meal and want to attend; do come, and, if available, we will sell you a meal. If meals appear to be sold out, we will ask you to wait until 11:20 AM so we can confirm that a meal is available. You are always welcome to attend the meeting and listen to the speaker.
- 4. As before, you will bring a personal check for \$38.00 made out to SIR Branch 8, or cash to the luncheon as payment.

- If you sign up, but do not attend the luncheon, or if you cancel after 5-days prior to the luncheon, you remain subject to payment because we owe Boundary Oak for the lunch that they have prepared for you.

Constant Contact emails have been very successful and makes sign-up easy. However, these emails do not reach all members for one reason or another. You should do this at least 5-days prior to the luncheon to ensure that you have a meal.

If you cancel after the deadline or do not show-up, we will follow-up with you to find out what happened. We do not expect members to pay for missed luncheons when there has been a health issue within your family.

#### SIR BIOGRAPHIES

#### Big Sir, Tom DiGrande



Born in San Francisco and raised in Oakland. Graduated from Oakland Technical High School. Married my high school sweetheart, Sharon. Have two beautiful and smart daughters, two great sons-in-law, and two amazing grandsons.

Started working as a Lube Technician in Oakland, and advanced to a Service Management position. Eventually offered a management position with a large national Dealership Group in Fixed Operations (Service and parts). As time went on, my reputation grew, and I moved to another Dealership Group out of Oregon as Area Service and parts Director (over Fixed Operations of 16 facilities). Had the opportunity to join a local Dealer Group as a Managing Partner & Director of Fixed Operations (12 Dealer facilities). After 50 years in Dealership Fixed Operations, I retired in December 2016 and joined SIR.

#### Little Sir, Dan Smith



I was born in Norfolk, Virginia, and have family there. I like to say that I grew up from Maine to Florida, so as to include upstate New York. It turned out that during these years we lived either close to or on various bodies of water; thusly I spent a lot of time on the water. This and my mother's family having operated a shipyard influenced my decision to become a naval architect. I graduated from Virginia Tech (BS) and M.I.T. (MS) with degrees in naval architecture and marine engineering.

I went to work at Newport News Shipbuilding when I graduated. While there I got to research the application of a newly developed computer based structural analysis (NASTRAN) to the design of the Los Angeles Class submarine. I left Newport News because of a divorce and came to California by way of Texas. I met my wife Lynda in LA. We soon ended up here in the Bay Area. We have been married over 50 years, now. I've worked for several

different companies here before going back to Rosenblatt 30 years ago where I became their Chief Naval Architect. I worked part time after retirement, mostly in the engineering of the ShipLift dry dock system.

There have been two aspects of the marine field that I have particularly liked: the diversity of work and the worldwide travel. When I tell someone that I weigh ships, I get a quizzical look in response, as to how you do that. I tell them that we measure the hole it makes in the water, which is pure Archimedes. I've lost count of how many vessels on which I have either performed a deadweight survey or a stability test (or inclining, a test where we heel the vessel to determines its VCG). I've inclined drill rigs, naval ships, ferries, oceanographic ships, a cruise ship, even floating caissons (gates) for dry docks. I have also been involved with structural analyses for many different projects, frequently using NASTRAN, and I get involved with marine systems.

My hobbies range from genealogy, gardening and carrying out home projects. I like to play cribbage and bridge with the guys. I also like the sociability of walking. I became the editor of the Hotline, relieving Chuck Joyce after he moved to Arizona. I assist Dennis Mierzwa with cribbage. And I took on attendance under Bill Peterson, later assisting Manuel Dominguez, which is a BEC position. I will pass on the Hotline to Chris Wehling and Assistant Attendance Secretary to John Vallor when I take on Little Sir in 2025. I will state that SIR has become a community for me with all of its guys and what we do.

Aida is a very long opera, so the matinee starts early.


Reviews of "Aida" at the Metropolitan Opera generally praise the grand scale of the production, with its large sets, elaborate costumes, and powerful chorus, but often criticize the staging as feeling somewhat static and outdated, particularly when paired with casts that lack dynamic acting ability; some reviewers have noted that while the music and chorus shine, the overall production can feel routine and tired.



Unfortunately, Cochrane's triumphs at sea were matched by political reverses at home in Parliament, and he even spent time in Bathgate Prison because of a reputed scandal on the stock market that is still being contested in this century. Like our own John Paul Jones, Cochrane went on to serve in other navies because of personal conflicts and lack of recognition at home. The book was generally well-received by our book group, although there were some reservations with the slow beginning before the action picked up. It received a rating of 3.7 out of a possible 5.

Our next book is a work of fiction, *East of Eden*, by John Steinbeck. We meet at 10:30 a.m. the first Tuesday of each month at the Concord Round Table Pizza on Treat Boulevard.





#### January 14, 2025, Easy Hike – Diablo Hills Golf Course to Downtown Walnut Creek, 10:00 a.m.

**Hike Description** – This venue has become the mainstay for the first easy hike of the year. It is perfect for a wet-weather outing, and we don't have to drive to get to a burger/beer lunch spot. What could be better for starting out the new season?!

This is an out and back hike of 3-4 miles starting at 10:00 a.m. The paved hike starts at the Contra Costa Regional Canal Trail, which we access from the parking lot near The Gardens, which is across the street from the Diablo Hills Golf Course parking lot. We pass through Heather Farm Community Garden and Lake. When we reach the Iron Horse Trail, we make a left to downtown Walnut Creek. We return to our trailhead via the reverse route.

**Directions to Trailhead** – Take Ygnacio Valley Road to Marchbanks Road. Turn left on Marchbanks if heading east on Ygnacio (or right if heading west on Ygnacio). When you reach the golf course parking lot, park on the street. There are plenty of spaces.

What to Bring – Water, appropriate footwear, trekking poles, hat, and sunblock.

# January 28, 2025, Hard Hike – Briones Valley to Tabletop and Seaborg Trail Loop – 10:00 a.m.

**Hike Description:** A return to Briones Regional Park for our first hard hike of the year. It is a 5.6-mile, 1000-foot AEG hike beginning at 10:00 a.m. The route is a loop that is exposed on the outbound leg and offers 40% shade on the return. We head east 1.8 miles on the Old Briones Road and Valley Trails, which are mostly level with limited shade. Shade arrives at the end of the Valley Trail, with a steep climb to a trail junction. If there is enough excitement, we'll turn left to include Briones Peak panoramic views. This will add 0.6 miles and 300 feet more climbing to our hike (see route, AllTrails map below).

We then head south via Tabletop and Briones Crest Trail, which offers Diablo and southern views, before descending on Seaborg Trail. This 1.6-mile trail is wooded for the descent, bordered by trees along Homestead Valley and heavily shaded at the end sportion where we re-connect to the Old Briones Road very near our start.

Optional lunch: Europa Hofbrau in Orinda, 64 Moraga Way.

**Bring:** Hiking boots and water. Trekking poles are useful for the steep stretches. Assume restrooms are not available, although one porta potty is often available at the trailhead.

**Directions:** Take Hwy 24 west from Walnut Creek to Orinda. Exit on Camino Pablo northward toward Orinda Village/Richmond. Proceed 2.5 miles, then turn right at the light onto Bear Creek Road. Proceed 4.4 miles to the Briones entrance road on your right. Enter the park, and after passing the entrance booth, go straight ahead to the parking lot.
