LUNCHEON SIGN-UP

Sons in Retirement originated in 1958 in San Mateo when four retired businessmen got together for a social luncheon with the purpose of promoting this activity for all retired men. This idea evolved into the organization that you are involved with today. We continue to believe that holding luncheons for social



interaction and to listen to timely presentations is a wonderful activity. We hope that you value this, as well. The monthly luncheon is the backbone of SIR and why SIR exists. If you have not attended these luncheons for a while, we encourage you to join your fellow SIR members and enjoy retirement life.

We ALL must sign up to attend the Branch 8 luncheon held at Boundary Oak Golf Course, 3800 Valley Vista Rd., Walnut Creek, CA. You will have a choice of a meat, fish, or vegetarian entrée. You can also select no meal. Please tell us which entrée you want when you sign-up:

- Three sign-up methods will be available for yourself and if you want to bring a guest. Just let us know including your choice of meal:
 - a. A Constant Contact email requesting your action to sign up to attend a Branch 8 luncheon will be sent to you. Click on the link in this email to electronically sign up for the next luncheon. You will need to enter your name as well as any guest's names, your and your guest's meal preference. You should receive a message immediately that your response has been recorded. This is the preferred method.
 - Send an email message to <u>sirbr8attendance@outlook.com</u>. You will receive a confirming email.
 - c. Call 925-901-4826 to sign up for the luncheon by phone.
- You must sign 5 calendar days before the next luncheon (i.e., the Wednesday before the luncheon). This deadline is necessary because we must provide a final headcount to Boundary Oak.
- 3. We have been fortunate in being able to accommodate those who sign up late or simply walk-in. If you are not on the sign-up list for the meal and want to attend; do come, and, if available, we will sell you a meal. If meals appear to be sold out, we will ask you to wait until 11:20 AM so we can confirm that a meal is available. You are always welcome to attend the meeting and listen to the speaker.
- As before, you will bring a personal check for \$38.00 made out to SIR Branch 8, or cash to the luncheon as payment.

- 5. If you sign up, but do not attend the luncheon, or if you cancel after 5-days prior to the luncheon, you remain subject to payment because we owe Boundary Oak for the lunch that they have prepared for you.
- If you have any questions regarding the sign-up process, contact Manuel Dominguez (<u>dominguezx@comcast.net</u>) or Dan Smith (<u>dns.lns02@astound.net</u>).

Constant Contact emails have been very successful and makes sign-up easy. However, these emails do not reach all members for one reason or another. If you believe that you have been missed, or if away during the sign-up period, even if uncomfortable with the automatic reply, you can always use the attendance email or voicemail given above anytime. You should do this at least 5-days prior to the luncheon to ensure that you have a meal.

If you cancel after the deadline or do not show-up, we will follow-up with you to find out what happened. We do not expect members to pay for missed luncheons when there has been a health issue within your family.


OPERA IN THE THEATERS **††**

We have a real treat in store for us on Saturday April 26: Mozart's "The Nozze di Figaro." It hasn't opened yet so I don't have any reviews of this year's




excerpt from a review of the Met's most recent performance of the opera in 2017, which gives you the idea:

The overall rating was 3.3 out of a possible 5.

April 8 Easy Hike - Sugarloaf Open Space Loop from Rudgear Park WC - 10:00 a.m.

Hike Description: Sugarloaf is a small gem of open space snuggled into the southern part of Walnut Creek. It is easily accessible from Rudgear Park, about 1/4 mile from the Open Space entrance. The hike is a short 2.5-mile loop. But the net elevation gain is at the outer limits for an easy hike, just under 300 feet. We hike up Center Trail to the Ridgetop Trail, stopping frequently during this rigorous uphill climb. We have great vistas of Walnut Creek and Mount Diablo while overlooking green hills. We hike north on Ridgetop, then turn right on the less steep Orchard Trail, descending in a loop to the Open Space entrance. We return to our parked cars by touring some of the sport fields of Rudgear Park.

There are bathroom facilities at the Open Space area and at Rudgear Park, as well as ample parking.

Directions: From Walnut Creek, drive south on 680 to the Livorna Exit. Turn left up the hill to Trotter Way, turning left. Then turn right on Dapplegray Lane, then left on Stewart Ave. The Rudgear Park parking lot is on your right. Physical address is 2261 Dapplegray Lane. Meet in the main parking lot at 10:00

April 29 Hard Hike - Black Diamond Mines Trail loop, Antioch 9:30 a.m.

TRAIL Description: We start at the Black Diamond Mines inner parking lot at the end of Somersville Road. From the parking lot, we go to Nortonville Trail through the Rose Hill Cemetery, where you take a short break looking at the scenery and the oldest and most famous cemetery near here. Continue up and down hill to the old town location of Nortonville. Continue onto Black Diamond Mines Trail loop up the hill, then continue on the paved road to the top. Then we go downhill all the way on the same



Black Diamond Mines Trail (non-paved) until Manhattan Canyon Trail, which will take us back to Nortonville Trail and back to the parking lot. **DISTANCE AND ELEVATION**: 5.6 miles, 1,280 feet.

TO GET THERE: From the East Bay/Walnut Creek Area, take Ygnacio Valley Road past Walnut Creek and Clayton. The Road changes name to Kerker Pass. Keep going over the hill and go right at the 3rd traffic light, to Bucanan Road for about 3 miles. Go right onto Somersville Road all the way to the end of the road. (You will pass John Donlon Blvd. and Black Diamond Mines gate first.) There is a large free parking area to the right. We hike starting at 9:30 a.m.

GPS LOCATION: 5196 Somersville Road, Antioch. ** Please note, this address is only to the ranger station, continue on the same road for about 1 mile to the end, where the parking lot is.

RESTROOM: At the parking lot.

BRING: good shoes, hat (no shade), water, snacks; hiking poles are recommended.
