Those of us that attended the July luncheon listened to Debora Allen explain BART's fiscal cliff issues. Ridership has recovered to a maximum 47% of what it was pre-pandemic. Costs have risen without regard to the decline in ridership. The difference in the budget has been covered by Federal emergency funding sources. Now that these sources will end and any inclination to obtain fiscal relief through a proposition or the like, will be challenging.

Debora stated that early polls indicated that this would fail. So, what is BART doing about this? There are no easy answers. I searched online and found their website, https://www.bart.gov/about/financials/crisis. Basically, I saw what Debora described. They recognize the issues. But they are far apart in seeing a resolution; I see the impasse. Including, what is being done to mitigate labor costs? BART makes the case that their cost per vehicle revenue hour, a standard shared by this industry, compares very favorably with all agencies throughout the country. The model (business plan) that they require needs to be restructured to the present day. Going forward, it is great not to be wanting, but so many public sectors are not good at saving for a rainy day – like a pandemic – a really, rainy day.

We did not get to see Debora's supporting material. We had a problem with our new laptop; in fact, it failed for the second time. I did what damage control I could do with our guest speaker. Debora knew what she wanted to say and moved on. I will suggest that Debora was drawing upon the material that is in BART's website, see above.

In the meantime, our powers to be behind our laptop (Tom DeGrande, Derek Southern, Garland Bell) made the very rational decision to return it to Costco and obtain a laptop from Best Buy. We should not be having issues with the laptop in the future. Can we move on, now?

I saw the pictures that Dan Crowley took of the Bargain Bites at Maguey Mexican Restaurant. That was a great turnout, and I thank Ken Main, Ron Maciak, and Linda Gawura for arranging this event. This was Ken's first offering as activity Chairman. Hopefully, its success will induce Ken and all to plan more of these events.

In August we welcome Dawn Manley and Willie Mendoza of the Food Bank of Contra Costa and Solano. Many of you already know the organization very well. Of interest, the Food Bank is experiencing their own rainy day in the form of reduced Federal aid. They may also be seeing in reduction in demand because of the Trump Administration's aggressive immigration policies. I hope that they explain this to us.

LUNCHEON SIGN-UP

We continue to believe that holding luncheons for social interaction and to listen to timely presentations is a wonderful activity. We hope that you value this, as well. The monthly luncheon is the backbone of SIR and why SIR exists. If you have not attended these luncheons for a while, we encourage you to join your fellow SIR members and enjoy retirement life.

We ALL must sign up to attend the Branch 8 luncheon held at Boundary Oak Golf Course, 3800 Valley Vista Rd., Walnut Creek, CA. You will have a choice of a meat, fish, or vegetarian entrée. You can also select no meal. Please tell us which entrée you want when you sign-up:

- Three sign-up methods will be available for yourself and if you want to bring a guest. Just let us know including your choice of meal:
 - a. A Constant Contact email requesting your action to sign up to attend a Branch 8 luncheon will be sent to you. Click on the link in this email to electronically sign up for the next luncheon. You will need to enter your name as well as any guest's names, your and your guest's meal preference. You should receive a message immediately that your response has been recorded. This is the preferred method.
 - Send an email message to <u>sirbr8attendance@outlook.com</u>. You will receive a confirming email.
 - c. Call 925-901-4826 to sign up for the luncheon by phone.
- 2. You must sign 5 calendar days before the next luncheon (i.e., the Wednesday before the luncheon). This deadline is

- necessary because we must provide a final headcount to Boundary Oak.
- 3. We have been fortunate in being able to accommodate those who sign up late or simply walk-in. If you are not on the sign-up list for the meal and want to attend; do come, and, if available, we will sell you a meal. If meals appear to be sold out, we will ask you to wait until 11:20 AM so we can confirm that a meal is available. You are always welcome to attend the meeting and listen to the speaker.
- As before, you will bring a personal check for \$38.00 made out to SIR Branch 8, or cash to the luncheon as payment.
- If you sign up, but do not attend the luncheon, or if you cancel after 5-days prior to the luncheon, you remain subject to payment because we owe Boundary Oak for the lunch that they have prepared for you.

Constant Contact emails have been very successful and makes sign-up easy. However, these emails do not reach all members for one reason or another. If you believe that you have been missed, or if away during the sign-up period, even if uncomfortable with the automatic reply, you can always use the attendance email or voicemail given above anytime. You should do this at least 5-days prior to the luncheon to ensure that you have a meal.

If you cancel after the deadline or do not show-up, we will follow-up with you to find out what happened. We do not expect members to pay for missed luncheons when there has been a health issue within your family.

SIR BRANCH 8 Distinguished Service Award

NOTE: The Branch 8 award is made in the memory and spirit of Ed Benson, the late SIR State President and Big Sir of Branch

The Distinguished Service Award (DSA) is an award for significant and extraordinary contribution by a member at the Branch level. This award provides a high level of recognition to members second only to the Honorary Life Member (HLM) Award for their service to SIR. As indicated in this document, the DSA is initiated by a Sponsor's nomination, reviewed by the Branch Awards Committee (BAC), recommended by the Branch Executive Committee (BEC), and approved by the Big Sir.

Criteria for Selection

This award is the second highest award in SIR after the Honorary Life Member (HLM) award. It is to be earned and bestowed upon a member who has significantly contributed to the success of the branch through a major singular contribution or multiple contributions over a period of years. As demonstrated by Ed Benson, the member's contribution(s) should show willingness to volunteer, an effort to make positive change, and creation of a sustainable result.

The following factors should be considered, with most met, for the nomination and approval of the DSA award:

- Been a Sir member in good standing for 3 or more years
- Demonstrated contributor to the Branch Executive Committee (BEC)
- Chaired one or more activities and participated in several Branch activities
- Initiated and established a new branch activity
- Offered new ideas or approaches for the management and/or operation of the Branch
- Demonstrated a history of volunteering or contributing to Branch objectives
- Acknowledged by peers as a positive and constructive contributor to the Branch
- Ensured that his contribution(s) is lasting and sustainable over time

NOTE: A DSA award may be authorized for a Honorary Life Member (HLM) when justified by exceptional contributions made after the HLM award. Additionally, the recipient of a DSA award may earn an HLM award.

Procedure for Approval

Sponsor – Any member of Branch 8 can sponsor another member for a Distinguished Service Award (DSA). The Sponsor must complete the DSA application (Form 45A) that describes the nominee's branch history and significant contribution(s). The DSA application is given to the Big Sir to begin review, processing of the award application.

Big Sir - Requests that the Branch Awards Committee reviews the DSA application and the nominee's contribution against the DSA criteria shown above. The Big Sir will also ensure that the award nomination process is communicated to branch members at least twice per year, and posted on the Branch 8 website.

Branch Awards Committee (BAC) - Annually, the Big Sir appoints this Standing Committee. It is comprised of 5 current members (3 BEC members including 2 directors and either the Membership Secretary or the Asst. Membership Secretary), 1 branch member with at least 5 years with the branch, and 1 long serving member with at least 10 years with the branch. This "experienced" member will be the Chairperson of the BAC.

The Committee will consult with the Sponsor as needed, and approve or reject the application. At least 3 BAC members must support the Award application for its preliminary approval, and submission to the full BEC. If not approved by the BAC, the application goes back to the Big Sir for communication of this result to the Sponsor.

Branch Executive Committee (BEC) - The BEC reviews the DSA Award application (Form 45A) in closed session (i.e. only BEC members present). At least 2/3 of the BEC members present must vote by secret ballot to approve the nomination and recommend it to the Big Sir. The Branch Secretary records the vote, and reports the results to the BEC.

Big Sir – Provides the final review and approval of the DSA application. If the DSA Award application is not approved, the Big Sir will notify the Sponsor. If the Award application is approved, the Big Sir will notify the Sponsor and Awardee, ask the Branch Awards Committee to obtain the DSA lapel pin and certificate, and organize the Award presentation to be made at a future SIR luncheon meeting.

The Membership Secretary will ensure that the DSA Award will also be noted in the Hotline and on the front page of the SirBr8 website. The Membership Secretary will ensure that DSAs are recorded on the SIRBr8 website via a drop down menu. Form 21 will be used to request the appropriate DSA award materials.

Award Format

The award presentation will be made by the Big Sir at an upcoming monthly luncheon. The DSA lapel pin and DSA certificate will be given to the new DSA recipient.

NOTE: A branch is only allowed to have a specific number of DSA recipient based upon the size of the branch. A chart regarding DSA Award availability is provided in the SIR Policy Manual under Policy 10 - Sir Awards and Certificates. After 5 years, the recipient becomes a Senior DSA Awardee and does not count against the branch DSA total.





August 12, 2025 Easy Hike: Alhambra Creek, Briones Regional Park, Martinez.

Hike Description: The hike will start at 10:00 a.m. This is a truly easy hike, going out and back along the Alhambra Creek in the north part of Briones. We will hike a total of about three miles with approximately 250 feet of elevation gain. The trail is broad and even with good footing. The ascent is a continuous, even climb along the creek which is likely just a trickle this time of year. In the past, some hike participants have opted to stretch this hike to a moderate hike outing, looping up and around Alhambra Creek and meeting up with the Diablo View Trail before returning to the parking lot and the easy hike trekkers. We can decide at the 1-1/2 mile mark.

What to Bring: Water, Hat, Sunblock, Trekking poles if you use

August 26, 2025 Hard Hike - San Francisco Northeast Tour -**Special Start Time**

Hike Description: This hike incorporates an up-and-down tour of the northeast section of San Francisco, including Coit Tower, China Town, North Beach, Nob Hill, and the Financial District. We hike about five miles with 550 feet of elevation gain, gathering in the social vibe of some of the most iconic cultural areas of the city. We ride BART to the Embarcadero Station following the special start times and instruction below. A stroll up the Embarcadero to the base of the steps leading to Coit Tower completes the first easy leg. The 400-step climb to the tower offers great views of the bay as glimpsed from the well-tended gardens along the way. Then a drop down into North Beach, across Broadway into China Town gives us a taste of these two historic SF locations. We proceed up Sacramento Steet, paralleling the street cars for the mile up to the top of Nob Hill where we can view the famous SF hotels and Grace Cathedral. A final meander down into the Financial District will bring us to an eating place where we can refuel before heading back to the east bay on BART. There are restrooms and water at the Ferry Building before the

start, and restaurant.


